


Metropolia in brief

Innovations are important – byt why?

- 1. Change happens!

Innovation: 1) Novelty (new thing) 2) that has been implemented 3) And which has created added-value




Note:

Someone who starts a project without having the full resources or knowledge


- Estimate, guess and gut feel

He did not know:


- Where he was going

The process and initiators of innovation



What hinders development of innovative ideas?

- Fixations and other obstacles in thinking
 - You believe in some rules
 - You "must" do something
 - Cannot think something (taboos)
 - You do not know the basics of the subject
- Personal values:
 - What is allowed, what is not allowed?
- Negative feedback, fear or negative reactions
- The "guessing" structure of brains





FREE Basi Coles on creating innovative ideas MIND

- Get rid of the obstacles
- Free your mind
 - In what situations brain creates ideas?
- Chizhenmihaily's "Flow"
- Constant positive feedback and acceptance of ideas
- Questioning own views and beliefs you can not prove anything for 100%!
 - Active and concrete approach => define your ideas!




Innovator must have a **lust** for implementing the innovation!





Why do innovations fail?

- Idea is bad
 - Too ideological, a product of small-minded thinking
 - No dialogical network
- No passionate central person
 - You cannot pass the flame on
- Bureacracy is the pest of innovations
 - More there are administrative tasks the less likely the innovation is to succeed
- No resources
- Wrong people doing wrong things
